Greetings from the Amazon, Brazil!

Grace and peace to you! This verse is our prayer and heart's desire. We know it is yours as well. This verse encourages us to serve the Lord and gives us the joy and peace to know that all we do in the Lord is not in vain. All seeds planted in the name of the Lord will one day bloom! What an amazing promise!

In God, the victory is ours! March was incredibly busy. Spiritual seeds were planted and watered. We had the wonderful privilege of seeing a few bloom and now we are praying for them to grow!! We partnered together with 3 mission teams from IL, meeting needs in river villages and evangelizing all ages.



The first boat trip, six hours with seven American team members and Team Leaders, Pam and Marty O'neall, was to the village of São Sebastião do Miriti. It was a medical/dental clinic trip coordinated by our Asas de Socorro mission staff. It was great to have Pam assist both Brazilian dentists! This was a village where we were hoping to finish a church we started building last year. There was still a lot of opposition, but God overruled the leader, and the guys were able to haul more wood (what a tough job!) and start putting up the walls. During one of the Bible times, a nine year old girl gave her life to Christ. Please pray with us that more seeds can be planted, watered, blossom and grow in this difficult place!



The second trip was in partnership with Newlife Church, IL. (Team Leader: Dennis Sohn, 11 team members) to the village of Muira Cupuzinho on the Urubú River (19 hours). We worked on church construction, delivered water filters, taught dental hygiene, did fluoride treatments and had several Bible times in different villages. We shared the miracle of Jesus calming the storm in the form of drama, participation from the students and with the aid of visuals. We actually "heard" and "felt" the rain, "experienced" the silence" after Jesus commanded "QUIET, BE STILL!" and sensed God moving among our midst! It was incredible to "see" the awe on the face of the youth who portrayed Jesus when we asked, "Who is this Jesus that has control over even the wind and rain?!" He had tears at the wonder of it all!





The 3rd mission trip was in partnership with Richwoods, Church, IL, Pr. Tim Barnes. Team Leaders: Jada and Henry. (twelve team members). We visited two villages. The team worked one day on a church construction in the first village and then we travelled (three hours) to the village of Apuaú, Black River to install more water filters and evangelize. There were around 110 children and 40 adults in all who heard the message of God's love and salvation.



We prayed with twelve year old boy who shared with us his deep desire to be a pastor. Jim is in the sixth grade and is trusting God to help him find a school where he can continue his studies. Please pray for Jim that God will continue to help him study the Word (he has a Bible) and that God would give him a hope and a future and open the doors for him to continue his schooling.

God is working in many lives through your prayers and partnership in these ministries. Seeds are being planted in remote areas through church constructions, the living testimonies of the teams, prayer partners and evangelical/health ministries. Pray with us that the seeds the Lord has allowed us to plant will bloom and that many people will hear God's message, give their lives to Christ and Grow in His Grace!



This is a transition year in ASAS. In March, we voted in new by-laws and established a new leadership hierarchy. This was a big step in making necessary changes so we can as a mission be more effective in reaching out to those in need! During this time, the other pilot in our flight base and his wife were given a leave of absence because of stress and fatigue. Because of this, we were asked to stay in Manaus indefinitely in order to take over his resp. and implant a couple of new changes before we leave. Wilson is once again Operations Manager of Manaus. He will finish training the two new pilots and prepare two teams to alternate flights using the Caravan plane. Our prayer is that God will give him guidance to this end, flight safety and wisdom to follow through with these new changes. What a blessing it is to minister together with you and also to partner with churches and missions here in Brazil so we are able to reach the unreached with the Gospel and encourage pastors and churches throughout the Amazon!
