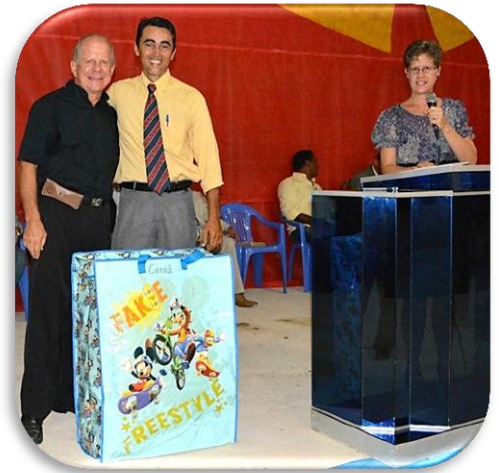


Greetings from Benjamin Constant

August was a month filled with victories! The two month Teacher-Training course for children's Sunday school teachers ended with a lot of enthusiasm and excitement. Seventeen teachers received certificates in front of seven church congregations all gathered together at the auditorium for our weekly Tuesday night service. Each church received a large bag (kit) including curriculum, visuals and supplies to initiate their Sunday school which began August 25th. I am accompanying these teachers weekly, offering orientation and support. I am also preparing five more kits for churches in the interior of the Javari river valley.

Wilson continues flying, helping out with church constructions here in town along with other church members (called multirões), preaching and working on projects at our flight base; clearing and leveling the land, installing fence posts and making a concrete base for the container that was donated (to be used for our office, tools and plane parts). Soon we will be working on making a wooden track (ramp) to enable us to take the plane out of the water and do maintenance on land. We cannot leave the plane “parked” on the main river.
