Twice a year I help coordinate a Children's Event together with Marinete. *On Sundays, we are enjoying preaching and ministering in the local churches each week. Wilson was in charge of the Easter service at a Presbyterian church since their pastor needs to fill the pulpit of a church in Tabatinga twice a month until they find a new pastor. The choreography group from our church did a short drama presentation of the life of Christ from His birth to resurrection and we showed the Jesus Movie from Maria Magdalena’s point of view. What a powerful message of Christ’s redemption and saving Grace.*

*The end of April, Wilson will be holding the first module of leadership training in Islândia, Peru together with Pr. Edgardo and Evangelist Maurilho. They plan to hold seminary classes once every four months for Peruvian pastors and leaders from isolated river villages. The closest seminary is in Iquitos (very far). Without the resources or time for this kind of training (transportation, school costs and living arrangements for several years), the option of providing local training is much more viable.*

*We will also be welcoming a new missionary couple, Doug and Lydia Caudill, and their two and four-year-old children the end of this month for one week. They are independent Baptist missionaries from Tennessee who feel God calling them to possibly minister in this area as well.*
