where we stayed for two weeks and had the privilege of visiting and sharing in two supporting churches and two Bible study groups. We enjoyed visits with several more ministry partners. We


also made a short trip to St. Louis Julie and Brandon and ministry partners there. We don't have pictures of all our visits, but

One of our pastor coordinators, Pr. Edgardo, together with leaders from his church went into the jungle recently to cut wood and saw boards for two new church plants in Paulo Seco and Cavalo Cocha, Peru. They also cut boards to build a dormitory for the conference center just outside of Cavalo Cocha where leadership training conferences will be held. These men were so excited to use the new chain saw provided by New Life Church which has helped tremendously to reduce construction costs for these ministry projects.

FAMILY WITHOUT BORDERS INT.

In the past 10 years God has enabled us to plant 29 churches in Peru and Brazil through ministry partners, prayers, and mission teams. This seems like a lot, and we should be content, but our hearts cry out when we know there is so much MORE we could do. There are still hundreds of remote river villages and Indian tribes throughout the Amazon where there is no church, no one to tell them about the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, no hope!

Through God's direction, 30 pastors have been chosen to lead these churches. Wilson helps coordinate their ministries and provide leadership/seminary training modules throughout the year, together with our mission team, teaching them to evangelize, disciple and minister to the people in remote river communities. These pastors are taught from the very



beginning that their church needs to become a "mother church" (as Wilson puts it), spreading the Gospel to river communities throughout their area! The goal is to not only evangelize and disciple people in their own village, but to reach out to others in surrounding communities through house visits, Bible studies and "preaching points" so that someday those villages will have a viable Christian church where they too can know God and make Him known! These villages are far enough away that it would not be feasible to regularly attend the "mother church".

In order to carry out this ministry, several of these pastors need funds for gas to visit communities up and down river which enables them to care for the needs of the church and their families. When people in river communities learn to tithe, they give what they have: manioc, bananas and sometimes a very small amount of gas. They often don't have money, so they barter for items they need. Although we strongly encourage pastors to pitch in and work alongside the villagers in their community gardens, etc., they still need to spend the majority of their time carrying out the responsibilities of the ministry.

Many of you have already asked us: "How can we be a part of this?" In recent years God has planted in our hearts the desire to set up an organization to provide support for these pastors. **FAMILY WITHOUT BORDERS INT.** is a nonprofit organization where monthly support can be sent for pastor's ministries and/or ministry projects.
