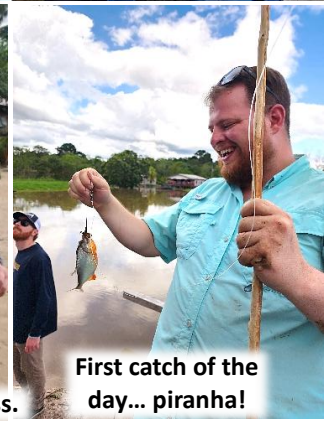


**"Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name;

The people there really love the Lord, but almost never receive visits or encouragement. I woke up around 3:30 in the morning to the sound of boat engines and people talking, only to find out later that the men were gathering for their morning time of prayer!*





*We ministered to the school kids the next morning, fitted the elderly with reading glasses in the afternoon and sang, gave testimonies, and preached in the evening service. We taught one last Bible lesson the next morning to the kids. They **LOVED** working on the Bible crafts that Lea and her friends prepared for all the lessons! Everyone, including the kids, constantly expressed their thanks for all we did with them and for them. I later sent two years of Sunday School Curriculum to both villages.*
